Cell members should bring:

Ceylon tea (about 15 bags)	Sugar (1.5kg)	5 drying up cloths
Rooibos tea (about 15 bags)	Milk (5 litres)	1 tray cloth
Coffee (large bottle Nescafe)	Small biscuits/treats to serve with tea (would be great to bless others)	

To do before the service:

Urn: fill the urn to $\frac{3}{4}$ and turn it to 6; once boiling turn to 1 for the duration of the service	Pack out mugs, cups and spoons on kitchen side of hatch (keep hatch closed till after service)
Ensure that the milk jugs are ready for milk (at least two) & Put sugar into sugar bowls	Ready 4 big metal tea pots (1 for Rooibos, 1 for Ceylon & 2 for boiling water for coffee)

Serving the tea

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Leave service during last worship song & turn urn to 6 for a few minutes to boil ❖ Warm tea/coffee pots, make tea & fill two pots with boiling water to pour over coffee ❖ Open hatch, fill milk jugs & put sugar and milk and teaspoons on the shelf ❖ Make up the ministry team tray with milk, sugar and about 12 cups of black tea and coffee

After serving the tea

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Wash up and pack away ❖ Be sure to collect mugs and cups from ministry team and those left on foyer table/in the hall
